How to reach us

Saronic Sails RYA Centre is based at Nea Peramos Marina, conveniently located about 45 minutes from Athens city centre (Syntagma Square), 50 minutes from Athens International Airport and approximately 40 minutes from Piraeus Port.

From Athens International Airport, a taxi transfer is recommended and typically takes around 45–50 minutes, depending on traffic. Alternatively, you can take the Suburban Railway (Proastiakos) to Nea Peramos and then continue to the marina by taxi.

From Athens city centre (Syntagma Square or the Acropolis area), a taxi is also the most convenient option, with a journey time of about 45 minutes. Public transport is available as well: take the Suburban Railway (Proastiakos) or a bus towards Megara, followed by a short taxi ride to the marina.

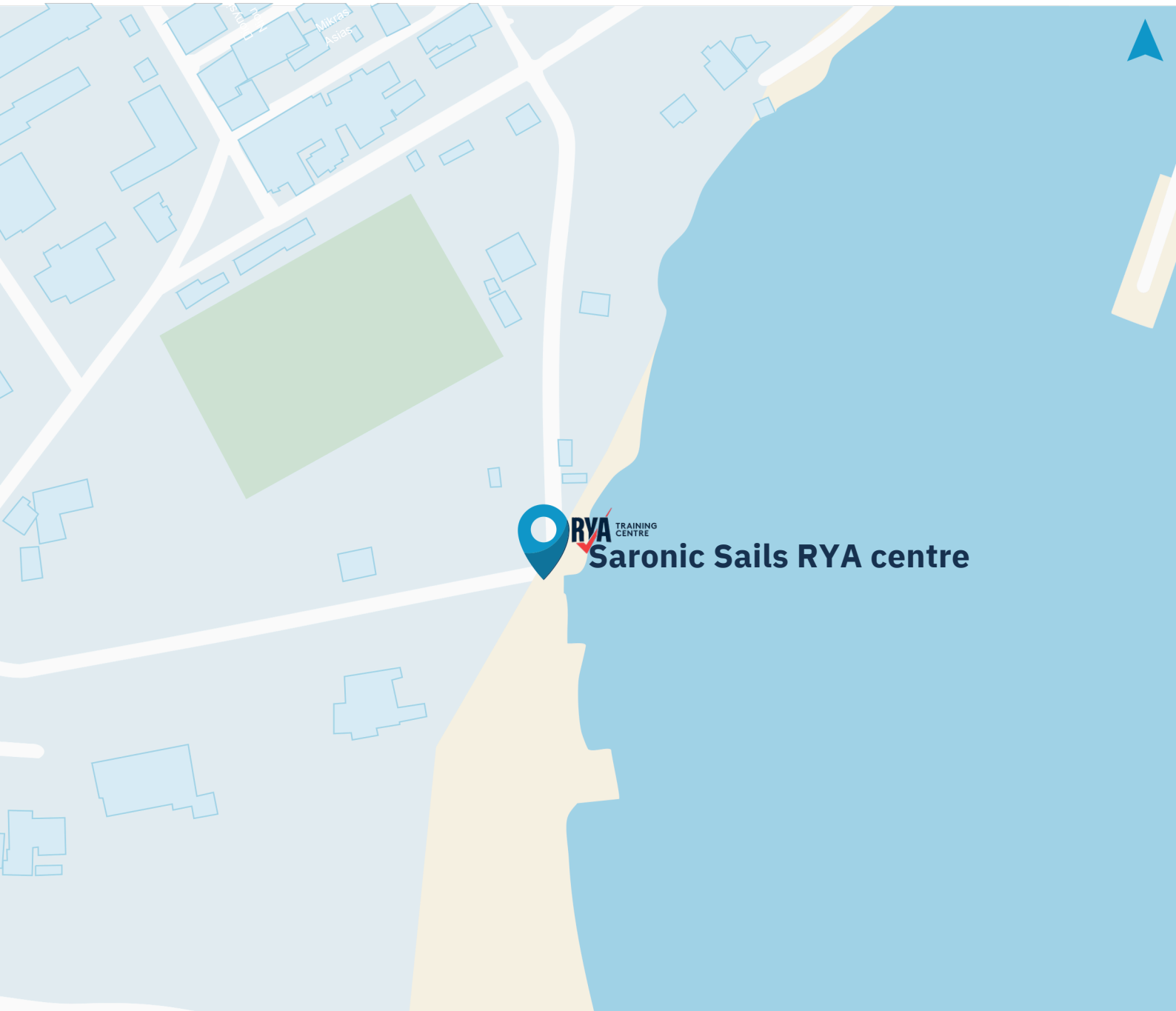

Useful Tips



Description

The SRC/VHF course is a one-day, shore-based program followed by an assessment lasting approximately 30 minutes to 1 hour.

Participation in the VHF course (including GMDSS) requires some preparation in advance. Once your place is confirmed, you will receive the VHF Radio (including GMDSS) Course Handbook G31 for pre-course study.

This preparation, which takes around 3 hours, is essential. You should focus on the following sections of the handbook to help you better understand the material and make the practical classroom session more effective:

- Introduction (pages 6–7)
- How Radio Works (pages 8–13)
- VHF Channels (pages 25–29)
- Prowords (page 40)
- Standard Vocabulary / Phonetic Alphabet (page 42)

The classroom SRC/VHF course and assessment begin at 09:00 and conclude at approximately 18:00.

Upon completion of the course, you will receive an RYA SRC Certificate confirming your attendance, which qualifies you to take the exam. The assessment, lasting about 1 hour, will evaluate both your pre-course study and the material covered during the course.

Participants are expected to have a basic understanding of the phonetic alphabet and VHF radio operation, and must bring their G31 handbook with them.
